

David Campbell Memorial Medals Awarded

The David Campbell Memorial Association annually solicits nominations of PF&R members for receipt of a David Campbell Award. The PF&R Awards Committee, with concurrence of the Fire Chief, submits the appropriate risk of losing one's life.

If the David Campbell Memorial Association decides on an award, the nominees shall be notified and the award presented at the David Campbell Memorial Ceremony, held each year on June 26th.



GOLD MEDAL

Gold Medal Award with Red/Gold Ribbon and Parchment Certificate

To any member, while in the performance of assigned duties, whose life may be a probable sacrifice in an attempt, successful or otherwise, to save the life of another, under conditions where the chances of losing one's life were obviously far greater than the chances of saving the life of another

To any member, while in the performance of assigned duties, whose life is at risk in an attempt, successful or otherwise, to save the life of another, but not under conditions where the chances of losing one's life are greater than the chances of saving the life of another, as is required by the Gold Medal.

Silver David Kingsley Medal with Red/White/Blue (Horizontal) Ribbon

To any member, while off duty, who uses rare judgment and unusual courage in an attempt, successful or otherwise, to save the life of another when there was risk to the member.

Temperatures were down into the 20s and Robert had to cut his way through heavy brush and steep terrain. Robert found the car that appeared to have rolled several times and was still sliding slowly down the slope on its side. The patient had multiple broken bones, lacerations, a history of breathing problems, and was gasping for breath. Robert identified that the patient was pinned in the car, so he called 911. There is no doubt of the hazards presented by the damaged car, steep terrain, freezing temperatures, and possible health exposures (during the pandemic). Robert chose to act, and persevered, throughout the course of the event. His off-duty actions are likely responsible for the survival of the man injured in this vehicle crash.

He entered the house and found a woman wandering in the smoke. He rescued her and her young daughter who was upstairs in bed. He remained on scene to provide information about the fire conditions to the arriving incident commander.
2025.03.07	2025.06.26	Brian Dundon	While off duty and on vacation in Mexico, a gas explosion occurred in a building housing swimming pool equipment. Lieutenant Brian Dundon, vacationing with his family, heard the explosion and took action to treat two workers who were severely burned, but remained near the site of the explosion. Despite language barriers and limited help from resort staff, Brian was able to provide immediate care and expedite transport of the two initial victims. He then treated two other victims with less serious injuries, assisting them in getting needed medical attention.
